Encouraging children to read at home not only supports their academic progress but also nurtures creativity, empathy, and emotional wellbeing.

## Safeguarding is a priority here

THC vapes are becoming popular among young people and are illegally available through online platforms including social media. THC is the main psychoactive ingredient in the cannabis plant. Possession is illegal unless medically prescribed.

Vapes claiming to contain THC often contain more harmful substances such as synthetic cannabinoids, often known as "spice". This is a very different substance and has contributed to a number of overdoses and even deaths in recent years in the UK.

Vapes sold with THC or other drugs are not legal so they do not go through any quality control testing. They look very similar to nicotine vapes so can be hard to distinguish. As this is a class B drug, possession has a penalty of up to 5 years in prison, an unlimited fine or both.

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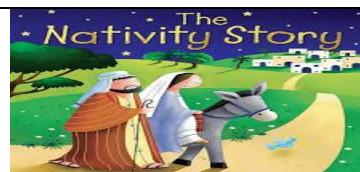


CHRISTMAS JUMPER DAY
